It will be helpful to you to have access to the internet and a computer to complete computer based homework this school year. We will be using Google Docs, Canvas, Go Math, and other computer based programs.

We will also complete a book challenge. 5th graders, your challenge is to read 30 books from 11 different genres and keep track of the books throughout the year. You will have a notebook containing all the information you need to be successful at this. The chapter book count begins on the first day of school.
